2005-2006**OUTLOOK**

ith the addition of two talented freshman newcomers, the Old Dominion University Lady Monarchs look to continue to improve and make program. Those freshmen, Alexis Garduno (Sacramento, CA) and Deztany Jackson (Oxon Hill, MD) comprise Head Coach Pat Kotten's finest recruiting class yet.

The rest of the squad features sophomore's Meghan Schaefer (Union, KY), Amanda Moore (Hudson, FL), and Bailey Mosier (Las Vegas, NV), junior Meredith Badali (Chesapeake, VA), and senior Reinie Vugrinec (Lewes, DE). Junior standout Ashley Davis (Toronto, Ontario) plans to redshirt in 2005 and return to competition next season.

Garduno has been ODU's top performer in every event during the fall season, finishing 8th at the William & Mary Tribe Classic, 21st in her collegiate debut at the Baytree tourney, and shooting no higher than an 84 in any round. She is expected to be the cornerstone of the Lady Monarch golf squad for the next four years and beyond.

Schaefer is also being counted on to provide the Monarchs with some veteran leadership after finishing as the Lady Monarch's top golfer in six different events in 2004, including a top-20 finish in the CAA Championships.

"The key returning player to look for would be <u>Meghan Schaefer</u> who was our low scorer at the conference tournament last season as a freshman", says Kotten. "She has made huge improvements in her game over the last few months. <u>Amanda Moore</u> was injured two tournaments into the year last season, and we didn't get a chance to see what she could do. From the first tournament to her second last season, we saw huge improvement and we hope to see some more of that this year. <u>Reinie Vugrinec</u> has also made huge improvements in her game and we look for big things from her this season."

One of the major bright spots for the Lady Monarchs this season is the opening of the brand new Lambert's Point Golf Course, which will serve as the base of operations and practice facility for the Lady Monarchs and is located on the ODU campus. Coach Kotten believes the course will be very beneficial to the long term success of the program, saying "the driving range here is absolutely tremendous, and now that we have the ability to videotape our work on the range, we can address mistakes immediately rather than having to wait a day or two when we used our old practice ranges again. The golf course itself, although it is 9 holes and is only a par-34, it is a very challenging course that puts a premium on striking an accurate tee shot. This is something that is really demanded of college players, particularly on the women's side because they have a minimum yardage they have to play.

Overall, the Lady Monarchs have been built to have a long era of success. With a roster full of young, talented ball strikers, the squad will certainly compete for many CAA titles in the years to come and could contend for a high conference finish this season should the team remain injury-free.

PatKotten Head Coach



at Kotten, a two-time conference Coach of the Year is now in his third season as Old Dominion University's women's head golf. Kotten has 15 years of Division I golf coaching experience. He served as the men's head coach at the University of Maryland Baltimore-County and started the women's program for which he coached for four seasons.

The men's program captured the NEC championship three straight years from 1998-2001. The men's team advanced to the NCAA regionals in 2000 and 2001. Kotten was named NEC men's golf Coach of the Year in 1999 and 2001. The

women's team at UMBC placed third at

the NEC Championships in 2001, their highest finish ever.

"I'm thrilled and honored to be a part of an institution that has such a tremendous reputation both academically and athletically", said Kotten. "I look forward to the challenge of building the program from the foundation. This program has unlimited potential given its location and support from the university, and I look forward to building that same support within the Hampton Roads community." Kotten served on the ECAC women's championship committee from 2000-02 and the men's championship committee from 1999-02.

A graduate of Towson University in 1994, with a degree in theatre, Kotten has also served as the assistant golf pro at Rolling Road Golf Course in Catonsville, MD. Kotten and his wife Elizabeth have two sons, Samuel Patrick(12) and James (10).

LAMBERT'S POINT
GOLF COURSE



he new nine-hole
Lamberts Point golf
course opened in the
summer of 2005. The course is
located on the west side of campus
and several holes overlook the
Elizabeth River. Built by the city
of Norfolk, the course is a par 34,
2800 yards long. It has two par
fives, three par fours and four par
three's. The first hole is 60 feet
high, which is the highest
elevation in the city of Norfolk.

The course has a 40-stationed, double-deck heated driving range as well as a clubhouse with locker rooms and offices for both the ODU men's and women's golf programs. Mike Fentress is the head pro at the course.
